### AN OPEN INVITATION

A very important part of every Eucharist is the collection of the people's monetary gifts which are used to support the works of the church. Those monetary gifts are presented by the Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality along with the most special gifts of bread and wine at the time of the Mass known as the Preparation of the Gifts which follows the collection.

Anyone is welcome to bring these gifts of bread and wine to the priest/deacon at any Mass. Usually the Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality have to "recruit" two people to bring up the gifts. All too often it is the same two people week after week. But anyone and everyone are welcome. It could be two people or more. In fact, an entire family could present the gifts.

This would be a wonderful way to observe a special family event: a wedding anniversary, a birthday, or other special occasions. If a particular Mass is celebrated for the intention of someone dear to you whose name is listed in the bulletin, this would also be a wonderful occasion for you to bring the gifts to the altar.

If you would like to volunteer to participate in this way at any Mass, please see one of the Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality and let them know at least 10 minutes before Mass. They will explain the very simple procedures.

**HIPAA & YOUR SICK FAMILY MEMBER**

**PLEASE INFORM US IF YOUR FAMILY MEMBER IS SICK &/OR HOSPITALIZED.**

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 [HIPAA] does many good things. At the same time, it creates a difficulty for us as a church. Information about your sick relative cannot be released to anyone. Therefore, priests, deacons, and Eucharistic ministers can no longer access names of St. Bon's parishioners in the hospital's Pastoral Care Department. The ONLY WAY for us to know that your loved one is in the hospital, rehab center, nursing home, hospice, or wherever, is through A PHONE CALL FROM YOU informing us of your family member's condition and whereabouts.

Recently I have been greatly saddened to find out at wakes and funerals that a parishioner had been in a nursing home for months and "nobody from the church came to visit our sick mother, father, brother, or sister." But we could not respond because we didn't know!

Ministry to the Sick of our parish is a priority. Of course, we want to bring the Eucharist and celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please don't hesitate to call the Parish Office [973.279.1016] to inform us of your relative's condition and location. We will gladly visit and try to bring some comfort and healing.
