FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY

Our St. Bonaventure community generously supported the food collection for the Father English Center, on Saturday, August 27th. Contributions included:

27 frozen dinners	8 cartons of canned goods
43 bags of groceries	7 bags of used clothing
200 lbs. of rice	

These totals include 20 bags of groceries and 50 lbs. of rice contributed by our Knights of Columbus Council #240. Thanks to all who made this donation possible and particularly to that parishioner who provided 9 frozen dinners with the help of neighbors and friend.

Those who survive day to day mired in poverty don't wear signs on their sleeves designating them as such. Yet they are among us all the same. In fact 28% of the families in Passaic County live below the poverty line. Remember your donations of food do more than address the physical needs of the poor. They also provide hope to parents who struggle to put food on the table for themselves and their children. Because you care, you also feed their spirit and give them courage to keep going. Thank you for all you do.
