FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY

Once again, our St. Bonaventure’s community generously supported the Father English Center food collection on Saturday, December 19th by contributing:

- 57 frozen dinners
- 60 bags of groceries
- 2 cartons of fresh vegetables
- 26 bags of used clothing
- 225 lbs. of rice
- 8 frozen turkeys
- 13 cartons of canned goods
- 50 lbs. of sugar

These totals include 23 bags of groceries, 25 pounds of rice, 2 cartons of canned goods and 1 frozen turkey contributed by our Knights of Columbus Council #240. As well as 6 bags of groceries, 2 frozen dinners and 2 bags of used clothing donated by residents of Mountain Ridge Towers in West Paterson. Thanks to all who made this food donation possible and particularly to that parishioner who provided 12 frozen dinners with the help of neighbors and friends. The fresh vegetables were provided by our parish’s Community Garden.

This has been the most generous response we’ve had this year to our monthly request for food to feed those poor and hungry souls who make the line every morning in front of the Fr. English Food Pantry. You are literally saving these people from hunger.

Please, as we go about our lives this month, continue to remember the poor and hungry in our midst and prepare for our next collection of groceries and frozen dinners on **Saturday, January 23rd.**

**THE FRANCISCAN CHALLENGE
Q & A's**

What is a Franciscan Friar?

The Franciscans, also called the Order of Friars Minor, are members of the Catholic religious order founded by Saint Francis of Assisi over 800 years ago. We seek to follow the manner of life that Saint Francis led. Our Order is a mendicant religious order of men who therefore depend directly on the charity of the people for their livelihood.

This new order founded by Saint Francis was prompted by a need to reinvigorate the life of the Catholic Church. At the present time the Franciscan Friars number 17,224 worldwide with 586 novices or "Friars in training".

Often times you will see OFM after a Friar's name, wondering what it means. It refers to the Order of Friars Minor commonly called the Franciscans.

What is a Franciscan Province?

A Franciscan Province is a geographic area of the country where the Friars of that province live and work. The Franciscan Order divides countries into provinces.

What is Holy Name Province?

Holy Name Province is the largest of seven provinces in the United States belonging to the Franciscan Order. It covers the eastern seaboard with some locations beyond. The Provincial headquarters are located in New York City.
