## **REGULATION FOR THE LENTEN SEASON**

Fasting is required for those 18-59 years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and *abstinence from meat* on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent for those 14 years and older.

Fasting means eating only one full meatless meal and two light meatless meals during the day. Fasting also includes no eating at all in between meals, although liquids are permitted. Abstinence means not eating meat at all that day.

### What Is the Proper Way to Receive Ashes?

My Dear Parishioners,

In past years we have permitted people to take ashes home in order to impose ashes on those who cannot attend mass or to keep as a sign of devotion during Lent. We will no longer be continuing this practice and I wanted to take a moment to explain why.

Ash Wednesday is the day when we begin the annual period of penance and conversion we call Lent. It is a time when we are called to evaluate and reflect on our relationship with God and how well we follow God's commandments in our lives. Ash Wednesday begins this process by inviting us to make a public commitment -- to God and to each other -- to carry out this process of penance and conversion. The reception of ashes is a public sign of this commitment. The public nature of this commitment is essential for the ashes to retain their proper meaning and not to become a meaningless tradition.

This kind of commitment can only be made within the context of a public liturgical service of some kind. The celebration of the Eucharist is the preferred liturgical context, but other services are permitted when necessary. It is for this reason that Catholic ministers are prohibited from giving out ashes on street corners, in restaurants, or in some other non-liturgical setting. It also explains why we cannot give out ashes in the Parish Office or even in the Church, outside of mass or some other liturgical celebration. To take ashes to one's home for Lent or to receive them outside of a liturgical service encourages us to think the ashes have some kind of "magical" power to effect conversion. Ultimately, ashes are an external sign of an inward commitment to conversion; what matters most is this commitment. The sign of ashes, while valuable when appropriately understood, is not essential.

Please know that if you cannot make it to one of our services, that Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation and no one is required to attend mass or receive ashes. This does not mean that you cannot commit yourself to the Lenten journey of penance and conversion in some other way. I encourage everyone who cannot join us to make such a commitment through prayer to God as they begin their Lenten journey.
