

Fr. Angelo Gambatese, O.F.M. +1933

Fr. Angelo was a native of the Stony Road neighborhood and lived at various times at St. Bonaventure Church while preparing for the priesthood and carrying out his ministries. He was a longtime counselor at Straight & Narrow, a Catholic Charities agency in the Diocese of Paterson. Fr. Angelo was a pastor of St. Stephen of Hungary in New York from 2002 to 2014. He created an overnight shelter for homeless men, started a farmers' market, held Thanksgiving dinners for those unable to be with family and established an interfaith speaker series on tolerance. Fr. Angelo lived his final two years at St. Bon's and then Holy Name Friary in Ringwood. At St. Bon's he celebrated Mass and heard confession and he also returned to Straight & Narrow as a volunteer.

May he rest peacefully in the Lord!

REGULATION FOR THE LENTEN SEASON

Fasting is required for those 18-59 years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and *abstinence from meat* on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent for those 14 years and older.

Fasting means eating only one full meatless meal and two light meatless meals during the day. Fasting also includes no eating at all in between meals, although liquids are permitted. Abstinence means not eating meat at all that day.



PRESIDENTS' DAY Mass on Monday, February 15th, is at 11:30 AM. The Parish Office will be closed.

WELCOME HOME TO HEALING

This Lenten season, each Catholic parish in the Diocese of Paterson will have Confession available every Monday evening from **February 15 to March 15**, from **7 PM – 8:30 PM**. If you have been reluctant to come to the Sacrament, have been away for some time or just found it difficult to get to a Saturday afternoon Confession time, this is a wonderful opportunity to re-connect with Christ and His Church. Also, please note that because the **Chrism Mass** will be celebrated on **Monday, March 21, 2016 at St. Philip the Apostle Parish, Clifton**. Procession begins at 6:45 PM; Mass will begin at 7:00 PM.

The last Monday confessions are March 14th. Also, once the Sacred Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, priests are not supposed to hear confessions except in situations of impending death. Thus, there will be no confessions on Holy Saturday. Saturday, March 19th from 1 -2 PM is the last regularly scheduled confessions before Easter. There are forty days of Lent, the season of reconciliation. Please do not wait until the last minute to avail yourself of this wonderful sacrament.
