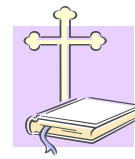

FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY

Despite the snow and poor driving conditions, our St. Bonaventure community still supported the food collection for the Father English Center, on Saturday, December 17th. Contributions included:

9 frozen dinners	0 bags of used clothing
36 bags of groceries	2 bags of used housewares
11 cartons of canned goods	
2 bags of toys	150 lbs. of rice

These totals include 22 bags of groceries and 2 cartons of canned goods contributed by our Knights of Columbus Council #240.

Contrary to the beliefs of many, the majority of those who struggle with hunger do not live in homeless shelters, nor are they chronically unemployed. Nine out of 10 people who miss meals have a place to live and nearly half are employed. Hungry people are everywhere and the shame in asking for help is tremendous.

Please, as we go about our lives this month, continue to remember the poor and hungry in our midst and prepare for our next collection of groceries and frozen dinners on **Saturday, January 21st**.

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

This reading is a short passage from the second song of the Servant of the Lord. The Lord will show His glory through His servant whose mission is to restore Israel and bring salvation "to the ends of the earth."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

Paul sends greetings to the people of Corinth, who have been called to be holy and consecrated in Christ.

Gospel: John 1:29-34

When Jesus visits John, John recognizes Jesus as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." John further indicates that Jesus is truly the Messiah and "God's chosen One."
