

CHURCH UNITY OCTAVE or THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

is being observed at all Masses in the Prayer of the Faithful from January 18th to the 25th. While we desire the unity of all who claim Christ as their Savior and Lord, the scandal of disunity among Christians remains, and so we must pray for Unity among all Christian churches!

Pope Francis has said religious persecution is uniting Christians around the world. He has called this sad affront to Christianity "an ecumenism of blood." He has said of these martyrs of our own day: "They are witnesses to Jesus Christ, and they are persecuted and killed because they are Christians. Those who persecute them make no distinction between the religious communities to which they belong. They are Christians and for that they are persecuted. This, brothers and sisters, is the ecumenism of blood."

During his homily Pope Francis called on Christians to look to the example of Jesus Christ and work together to spread the Gospel in our world: "(Jesus') example encourages us to seek a serene encounter with others. To understand one another, and to grow in charity and truth, we need to pause, to accept and listen to one another.... In this way, we already begin to experience unity. Unity grows along the way; it never stands still. Unity happens when we walk together.....

"Today there are so many men and women around us who are weary and thirsting, and who ask us Christians to give them something to drink. It is a request which we cannot evade. In the call to be evangelizers, all the Churches and Ecclesial Communities discover a privileged setting for closer co-operation.... For this to be effective, we need to stop being self-enclosed, exclusive, and bent on imposing a uniformity based on merely human calculations. Our shared commitment to proclaiming the Gospel enables us to overcome proselytism and competition in all their forms."

The Pope has also warned that unity "will not be the fruit of subtle theoretical discussions in which each party tries to convince the other of the soundness of their opinions...." He added with humor: "When the Son of Man comes, he will find us still discussing! We need to realize that, to plumb the depths of the mystery of God, we need one another, we need to encounter one another and to challenge one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, who harmonizes diversities, overcomes conflicts, reconciles differences."

LET US PRAY ... for the unity of all Christians during this Week of Prayer for Unity.... Lord our God, we thank you for the wisdom we gain from your Scriptures. Grant us the courage to open our hearts and our minds to neighbors of other Christian confessions; the grace to overcome barriers of indifference, prejudice or hate; and a vision of the last days. when Christians might walk together towards that final feast, when tears and dissension will be overcome through love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
