**FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY**

Our St. Bonaventure community generously supported the food collection for the Father English Center on Saturday, May 19th. Contributions included:

- 29 frozen dinners                      200 lbs. of rice
- 22 bags of groceries                      2 frozen hams
- 10 cartons of canned goods              2 frozen turkeys
- 20 bags of used clothing
- 25 lbs. frozen chicken breasts
- \$150 in donations

These totals include a \$150 donation to the NJ Food Bank for the account of the Fr. English Food Pantry made by our Knights of Columbus Council #240, as well as 2 frozen dinners, a bag of groceries and 5 bags of used clothing donated by residents of Mountain Ridge Towers in West Paterson.

REVITALIZATION AND RESTRUCTURING

Dear brothers and sisters,

As you know, six of the seven OFM provinces in the United States have been discussing restructuring since 2012. Last week, the friars of Holy Name Province and five other provinces voted on May 30th to form one new province.

The other participating provinces were Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (based in Franklin, WS), Our Lady of Guadalupe (Albuquerque, NM), Sacred Heart (St. Louis, MO), St. Barbara (Oakland, CA), and St. John the Baptist (Cincinnati, OH).

This new province will better serve the friars' fraternal life and ministry in the United States by reducing the number of friars involved in administration. For example, there are 30 friars serving as provincial councilors now; the new province will free up more friars for other forms of ministry.

Like many other religious communities throughout the United States, we Friars Minor are facing a reduction in membership. During the 1960s and 1970s, we numbered 3,252 friars. Today, that total is fewer than 1,000 friars.

The reconfiguration of these provinces will not happen immediately. The next step in the process is to obtain approval to unify from the General Minister and his Council in Rome. Should he decide that such a reconfiguration would be helpful to Franciscan life and ministry, he will appoint a delegate to visit the six US provinces involved in the Revitalization and Restructuring (R & R) process. If the delegate's report is favorable, it is expected that the specifics and details of reconfiguration will be charted. There will also be issues of canon and civil law to resolve.

Given all of this, we anticipate that the new province will be officially launched no earlier than late 2022 or early 2023. The new province will be headquartered in a yet-to-be determined location.

All of us are wondering what this means for us in our ministries in Holy Name Province. For now, HNP's provincial offices in New York City will continue to operate as usual. Until the reconfiguration process concludes in what we estimate to be at least four or five years, we will continue to function as separate provinces. At this point, we don't know where the new provincial offices will be located. Nor do we know for sure what the restructuring might mean for St. Bon's. I am confident that we will continue on a steady course for the next five years and more! Fr. Frank and I will keep you informed as the process moves forward and we learn more.
